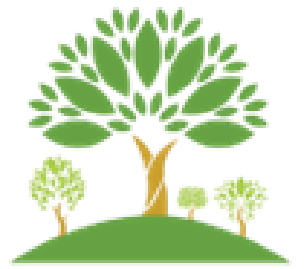

Phonics Screening Check

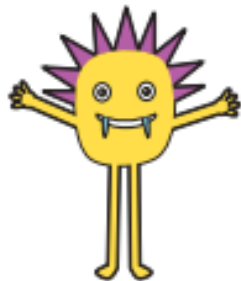

What is the Phonics Screening Check?

- Why?
 - To make sure children are on track with the phonics part of their reading development. If any children did not pass, extra support would be put in place to ensure they passed in Year 2.
- When?
 - Within the week beginning Monday 12th June 2023. Please ensure no holidays are booked in this time.
- How?
 - The children will take the test 1:1 with their class teacher. It will not be referred to as a test and there is no strict time limit.
 - The test itself is very similar to the type of reading activities they do daily within Read Write inc. phonics.

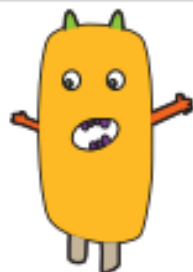

Home Learning Bags – use the phonics flashcards in the packs to play sound splat; practice blending; flashcards; make real or nonsense words; or, play outdoor active games like a sound hunt.
